1st day

Arrival in Airport Budapest, half day panoramic city tour
Check in 4* centrally located hotel, dinner in the hotel

2nd day

Half day sightseeing in Budapest admission to the Matthias Church and Fisherman's Bastion
Lunch in restaurant. Afternoon: visit at Gellért Thermal bath. Dinner in the hotel.

3rd day

Full day excursion to the Danube Bend, popular tourist destination rich in cultural and natural treasures. Visit of the Cathedral and Treasury in Esztergom, lunch in Visegrád, then shopping and a museum visit in Szentendre.
Arrival in Budapest late afternoon, typical dinner in restaurant with folklore show and live gypsy music.

4th day

Transfer to Vienna, en route we take a walking tour and have lunch in Bratislava.
Arrival in Vienna late afternoon, check in 3*Sup. or 4* hotel close to the city center. Dinner in the hotel

5th day

Full day sightseeing in Vienna, admission to the Stephansdom, lunch in restaurant and typical "Heuriger" dinner: Visit a typical Viennese wine tavern in one of the wine-growing districts on the outskirts of the city and enjoy a traditional meal accompanied by the sounds of the strolling "Schrammel" musicians.

6th day

Start to Prague. En route we visit two UNESCO World Heritage sites: the Abbey of Melk and the town and castle of Cesky Krumlov. Lunch in Cesky Krumlov then continue to Prague. Arrival in the evening, check in 4* hotel close to the city center. Dinner in the hotel.

7th day

Full day sightseeing in Prague, including admission to the Castle. Lunch in restaurant and typical dinner in a brewery.

8th day

free, transfer to the airport.
