Day 1 Budapest – Zvolen - Banská Bystrica - Cracow

special Slovak dish: Strapačky (type: dumplings)

Day 2 Cracow - Warsaw

Frédéric François Chopin was a Polish composer and virtuoso pianist. He is widely considered one of the greatest Romantic composers.

Chopin invented the instrumental ballade and made major innovations to the piano sonata, mazurka, waltz, nocturne, polonaise, étude, impromptu, scherzo and prélude.

special Polish meal: Bigos (type: cabbage)

Day 3 Warsaw - Leipzig

Johannes Brahms was a German composer and pianist.
Brahms wrote settings for piano and voice of 144 German folk songs, and many of his lieder reflect folk themes or depict scenes of rural life.

Day 4 Leipzig - Drezden

**Robert Schumann** was a German composer, aesthete and influential music critic. He is regarded as one of the greatest and most representative composers of the Romantic era. He composed works for piano and orchestra


Day 5 Drezden – Prague

Johann Sebastian Bach was a German composer, organist, harpsichordist, violist, and violinist of the Baroque period. Many of Bach's works are still known today, such as the Brandenburg Concertos, the Mass in B minor, the The Well-Tempered Clavier, his cantatas, chorales, partitas, Passions, and organ works.

Day 6 Prague

**Antonín Leopold Dvořák** - Czech composer. Dvořák's own style has been described as 'the fullest recreation of a national idiom with that of the symphonic tradition, absorbing folk influences and finding effective ways of using them'.

special Czech meal: 'Knédli' (type: dumpling) and BEER!

Day 7 Prague – Plzen - Munich

**Bedrich Smelana** was a Czech composer who pioneered the development of a musical style which became closely identified with his country's aspirations to independent statehood.

Day 8 Munich - Castle of Neuschwanstein - Salzburg

**Wolfgang Amadeus Wozart** was an Austrian, prolific and influential composer of the Classical era. He composed over 600 works, many acknowledged as pinnacles of symphonic, concertante, chamber, operatic, and choral music.

Day 12 Vienna – Fertőd – Győr

**Franz Joseph Haydn** was an Austrian composer, one of the most prolific and prominent composers of the Classical period. Haydn's work was central to the development of what came to be called sonata form. He worked for 24 years in Hungary in Eszterháza (Fertőd).

Day 13 Győr – Budapest

Franz Liszt was a 19th-century Hungarian composer, pianist, conductor and teacher. As a composer, Liszt was one of the most prominent representatives of the "Neudeutsche Schule" ("New German School"). He left behind an extensive and diverse body of work in which he influenced his forward-looking contemporaries and anticipated some 20th-century ideas and trends.

Day 14 Budapest – Kecskemét – Budapest

**Zoltán Rodály** was a Hungarian composer, ethnomusicologist, pedagogue, linguist, and philosopher. He is best known internationally as the creator of the worldwide known Kodály Method.
