The Best Breweries in Central-Europe

Get to know the major beer factories and the minor local breweries, the past and the present of beer production in Central-Europe!

1st day Budapest - Arrival

2nd day Budapest

The so called „gastronomic revolution” in Hungary has brought to existence a number of excellent microbreweries. Depending on your taste, we can visit one of these new fabrics or the country's oldest and largest brewery.

The day ends with a dinner cruise on the luminous Danube river.



3rd day Vienna - Transfer to Vienna

4th day Vienna

After a city tour we have a rest in one of the few microbreweries of Vienna and taste some beer specialities made with Vienna's first class drinking water, without any filtration and preservation methods. The beer tasting is accompanied by typical Viennese dishes, of course.



5th - 6th days Salzburg

You might not know that Salzburg is not only famous for its cultural traditions. For many people, Salzburg is Austria's secret capital city of beer as there are numerous micro-breweries and in-house breweries that contribute to the immense variety of beer available in the city. The first breweries laid the foundations for the young and creative brewers that have been livening up Salzburg's beer brewing scene for decades.

Visit to the monastery of Mülln, where beer has been brewed since 1621 following a closely guarded secret recipe and skillfully applying the art of old brewing techniques.



7th day Cesky Krumlov

We continue our tour to the charming world heritage site, Cesky Krumlov which has the Czech Republic's second biggest castle complex dating from the 13th century.

We get a taste of the local beer in the 400 year old Eggenberg Brewery which was founded by the Eggenberg family in 1630.



8th day Prague

Transfer to Prague.

Dinner in one of the local's favourite breweries known for its creativity and always changing beerlist.

(Jihoměstský Pivovar)



9th day Prague

Our city tour in Prague includes a visit to the Staropramen Brewery, the birthplace of Prague's most famous beer. Did you know that every 4th mug of beer sold in the Czech capital is Staropramen?

(lunch: Velkopopovická Kozlov)



10th day Plzeň

Visit to the city of Plzeň where beer has been brewed since the early 14th century. Plzeňský Prazdroj is the Check Republic's biggest beer exporter, home of the pilsner type of beer.

(Pivovar Marina Holešovice, Sousedský Pivovar U Banského)

It's a good idea to combine the visit with one of the open-air festivals, the microbrewery festival in September or the Pilsner Fest in October

11th day Prague - Departure

It's worth scheduling your tour for May or September/October when various cheerful beer festivals animate Prague and Plzen not to forget Munich's renowned Oktoberfest.
